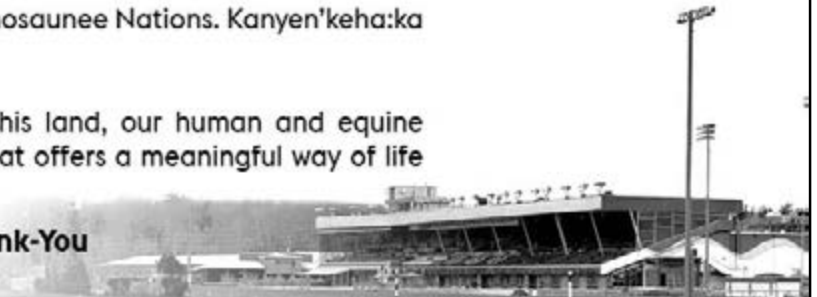

**#3 WARRAWEE XENIA** went winless through 19 tries as a five-year-old but hit the board seven times while stashing away more than \$139,000. She was third in the Armo Flight at this venue in June and rounded out the superfecta at 38-1 in the Breeders Crown at Hoosier Park last fall. This daughter of Walner had 10 victories from 22 attempts going into last season and lit the lamp in six straight over this surface at the age of three. She comes into her five-year-old campaign with a couple strong qualifiers under her belt and stopped the clock in 1:54.4 on the morning of May 10th when she scored by nearly six lengths. Bob McClure will be back between the wheels and she looks like she is ready to roll off the bench against a group that is well within her reach.

**#1 TOKYO SEELSTER** was beaten by only a nose to the one below on May 6th after making a first-over bid before the spin for home. He kept grinding away in that position before that rival shook loose in the late stages and has picked up a prize in three of his last four since returning to the races after a layoff of nearly five months. This 17-time winner was victorious in the class below this on April 15th and will be reunited with leading driver James MacDonald for tonight's tilt. He has missed a week between outings but will start from the pole position and might be able to navigate a favorable journey.

**#2 MRMAYOR HANOVER** tried to split horses in deep stretch last week but was in tight quarters before hooking wheels with a rival and took himself out of contention to finish eighth under the wire. He was placed back to ninth after it was deemed that he caused that mishap but he appeared to be moving forward with trot until that incident occurred. This 18-time winner had won two in a row going in that effort and sparked an upset at 12-1 when he got past the one above in the last steps two starts ago. He will move in a couple of spots on the gate and has rebound potential.

**#9 TRUFFLES TOO** exits the same race as the one above and worked hard to get to the lead by the midway point in that contest after landing in the four-hole off the switch. He trotted his own middle-half in 55.3 before weakening in the late stages and faded to fifth at the finish at odds of 7-1. This 21-time winner had hit the board in five straight before that but will shift towards the outside of the gate with post-nine. He has enough early foot to get forwardly placed but will have to avoid getting another taxing trip.

**#7 CAPT JACK HANOVER** disappointed at 50 cents to the dollar or less in each of his last two and faded on the lead in both of those efforts. He was dominant in victory at this level three starts ago when he scored by three lengths in 1:52 flat and has changed hands after five of his last nine. This 15-time winner will now race off the claim for trainer Duane Marfisi and will be reunited with driver Doug McNair. He has had a week off between appearances and can rebound in a big way. Giving him the edge.

**#3 CAPTAIN FIREBALL** slingshotted off second-over cover last week and paced past the one below in deep stretch to notch victory off the claim for top trainer Richard Moreau. He offered 3-1 to his backers when he tripped the timer in a new lifetime mark of 1:51.4 and has now been second or better in each of his last three. This 23-time winner will have his price tag increased by \$2,000 for tonight's tilt and that will move him two spots off the rail to post-three. He will have J-Mac aboard for an encore performance and doubling-up is not out of the question.

**#4 LETS GET ROCKED** went a long way on the lead from post-six in his latest and set an honest tempo before getting picked up by the one above in the late stages. He gamely battled on for the place spot and rounded out the exacta at 5-1 in his first try for Jacob Roberts after that conditioner snagged him for \$22,000 a week prior. This son of Downbytheseaside has hit the board in eight straight and has seven top-two finishes over that span. He will move in a couple of spots on the gate and will likely once again be the one to catch.

**#5 MAINTENANCE MAN** exits the same race as the two above and could not get past our third choice in the lane after sitting a perfect pocket trip for most of the mile. He has hit the board in each of his last seven and will now race off the claim for trainer Shayne Barrington. This 15-time winner will get jammed right back in for the same price tag of \$22,000 and will have Trevor Henry calling the shots for the first time. He will likely have his gas pedal pressed in the early going and can be in the mix throughout.

**#1 GHOSTLY CASPER** was second-best to Osceola in the final of the Canadian Sired Graduate Series on May 4th and was three lengths in arrears to that rival when he trotted his own mile in 1:53.2. He disappointed as the 6/5 favorite in the third leg of that added-money event but was impressive in victory in each of the opening two rounds. This son of Resolve has hit the board in 22 of his 33 career attempts and will now make the transition to lifetime non-winners condition classification. He will once again work from the pole position and can come out on top against this group.

**#6 STONEBRIDGE BRAVO** has spent each of her last three at the Meadowlands and claimed the show spot two starts ago in NW5000L4. She has hit the board in five of her last nine while competing stateside and now returns north of the border to race out of the barn of top trainer Richard Moreau. This daughter of Muscle Mass has a trio of victories over this surface and will have the luxury of leaving from post-six. She has missed over a month of action but will have top teamster James MacDonald at the controls for the first time and looms as a danger.

**#7 LIKE CHAOS** exits the same series as our top selection and had to settle for minor awards in fifth in each of his last three after being a runner-up in the first leg as the odds-on choice of the betting public. He only missed by a nose when finishing in the same position the last time he went postward in this class on April 1st and has been second or better in four of his last seven overall. He will have Trevor Henry back between the wheels and can threaten with the right type of trip.

**#4 EDEN ONTHEHILL** has finished in the top-three in each of his last four and most recently had to settle for the show spot at 9-1 in NW8000L5. He converted off a perfect two-hole trip at that level two back and has earned a cheque in seven of his last eight overall. This son of Muscle Hill has been in good order for conditioner Mark Goddard and will have Doug McNair giving the commands for the first time. He will likely get forwardly placed from post-four and can pick up a decent chunk.

**#6 HAPUNA BEACH** got on the vet's list for lameness in both of his last two and now resurfaces back in the barn of trainer Isaac Waxman. He was forced to qualify before he could enter the box again and posted a successful qualifier on May 10th when he was fourth in a race that was topped by Sylvia Hanover. This 20-time winner will drop back down to the level where he was a winner on March 18th and will have his price slashed by \$8,000 for tonight's tilt. He has gotten his picture taken in 11 of his 12 tries for this outfit and can return to his winning ways in this spot.

**#3 MAKE IT COME TRUE** went coast-to-coast from the pole position at Rideau Carleton on May 5th and scored by more than three lengths when he stopped the clock in 1:55.4. He was snagged out of that contest for \$10,500 by conditioner Isaac Waxman and will have his claiming tag raised by \$3,500 this evening when getting back on the big track for the first time since mid-February. This 16-time winner has hit the board in 53 of his 115 career outings and will have Bob McClure in the sulky for the first time under the lights. He completes a strong one-two punch for this barn and can be right there at the wire.

**#5 HIGHLAND BEACH BOY** has finished third in each of his last three and was on the heels of the winner last week when he rounded out the trifecta at odds of 3-1. He has changed hands after both of his last two and will now make his first try out of the barn of trainer Des Tackoor. This 24-time winner had his price upped by \$1,000 and will now race on the lasix program for the first time since January of 2021. He picks up the driving services of Doug McNair and figures to get every chance to land somewhere on the ticket.

**#8 LETS GET PICKLED** was shut out in each of his last two while going postward in the claiming handicap class above this and has since moved to the care of conditioner Brett Lester. He has been discounted by \$4,000 for tonight's tilt but is winless in 13 this season with four on the board finishes. This 21-time winner has 58 top-three performances from 150 lifetime tries and will have Tyler Jones in the bike for the third time. He is worth a look if the price is high enough and should not be left off the bottom end of the exotics.

**#9 CAPTAIN BUTLER** got away ninth off the gate from post-seven in NW8950L5 last week and was more than 12 lengths off the lead at the midway marker. He was able to grab a minor award by advancing to fifth before the wire and paced his back-half in 55 seconds flat with a final quarter in 27.1. This son of Captaintreacherous finished his mile with a broken hopple hanger and is just three starts removed from scoring by a neck against similar company on April 8th. He should appreciate getting class-relief this evening and gets top billing against this group.

**#1 PALLADIUM HANOVER** delivered at 65 cents to the dollar on May 9th at Flamboro Downs in NW3500L3 and converted off a pocket-ride in that dash when he tripped the timer in 1:54. He has hit the board in four of his last six on that half-mile oval and has trended in the right direction since going off the lasix program at the end of March. This 12-time winner should be feeling good about himself when getting back on the big track and will likely be pushing out for a favorable spot off the gate from the pole position. He figures to make his presence felt throughout and can be right there at the wire.

**#10 FOREFATHER** disappointed as the 7/5 favorite when he made the transition to this class last week and tried to come from a long way off the pace in that dash. He was nearly 14 lengths off the lead at the quarter pole and paced his final panel in 27.1 on the heels of a back-half in 55 seconds flat. This 13-time winner will get another crack at this class but now must overcome the dreaded 10-hole. He fits in nicely with this group and will likely be doing his best work when it matters most. Jody Jamieson picks up the steer.

**#7 CHIEF OF STAFF** got away in the early two-hole from post-six in an amateur driving tilt and was shuffled back to sixth on the spin for home but was able to split rivals for clear racetrack in the stretch. He picked up a smaller share when he finished fifth at odds of 9/2 and had walked away empty-handed in all of his previous six. This 14-time winner will be reunited with Trevor Henry and should offer a decent number on the tote board. He will be making his sixth straight start for trainer Clifford McGuire since relocating to this circuit and is worth using in the underneath positions of the exotics.

**#1 ANDY OVER** rallied for fifth last week after getting backed-up to ninth on the spin for home but was placed back to that position because of a pylon violation on the first turn. He trotted home in 28.4 off back-half in 58.3 and had hit the board in each of his prior seven outings on the B-tracks. This 34-time winner notched a victory in the Preferred at Western Fair two back and should much prefer the company he keeps this evening when sliding down to the pole position. He races for a barn that has won five of their last 11 at the time of writing this and gets the nod on top.

**#3 BUCKTOBER** was second-best to the one above on May 7th as the 6/5 favorite at The Raceway in a Preferred trotting event and trailed throughout in that dash before making up significant ground in the stretch. He finished third at this level two back but was placed back to fourth for committing a pylon violation of his own in the lane. This 24-time winner is just a few efforts removed from capping off a two-race win-streak in this class and will likely be closer to the action this time out when moving back towards the inside of the gate. He might be able to turn the tables on the one above but we prefer it to run out the same way it did the last time they met.

**#5 VICTOR INVICTUS** had not raced since the beginning of February and sparked an upset at more than 15-1 two starts ago in NW4100L5. He prepared for his return to the races by being the runner-up to Adare Castle in a qualifier on May 13th and stepped his own mile in 1:58 flat. This 11-time winner has picked up a prize in 10 of his last 13 overall and does not look out of place against this group. He will start from the center of the gate and might be able to help spice things up underneath.

**#4 VILLEFRANCHE AS** went a long way on the lead last week in NW4350L5 and was only beaten by a length by Classic Magic when she finished third 16-1. She has hit the board in six of her last eight and will slide in a few spots on the gate to post-three. This 22-time winner will have options off the gate and has proven to be versatile in her racing style throughout her career. She continues to get along well with Louis-Philippe Roy and can pick up another sizable slice.

He was coming through with pace in between horses under the wire and was snagged out of that contest for \$11,000 by conditioner Gerard Demers. This 39-time winner is only two starts removed from a nine-race win-streak and will once again have leading driver James MacDonald at the helm. He has been racing at the top of his game and should be brave coming into this.

**#2 MILITARY SECRET** faded to fifth on May 6th after sitting a perfect trip behind Lets Get Rocked and disappointed as the 7/5 favorite in that dash. He took that support after he was a solid second to the one above on April 29th and will now race off the claim for trainer Isaac Waxman. This 23-time winner will likely once again utilize his early foot to land in a favorable spot off the switch and will be reunited with driver Doug McNair, who has piloted him to five victories in the past. He looms as an obvious danger and will likely not go down without a fight.

**#8 SUNSHINE LOVE** only missed by a nose to the one below last week and completed the exacta at odds of 15-1 after being spotted third-over on the bend for home. He has earned a cheque in three of his last four since getting more than a few months off but has been camera-shy throughout his career with just four wins from 55 attempts. This son of Sunshine Beach has hit the board 27 times over that span and will have Jody Jamieson calling the shots for the fourth consecutive outing. He can hit the ticket with the right kind of trip.

**#6 MR BEAST** exits the same race as the one above and just held that rival off by a nose at the finish to convert at 30 cents to the dollar. He has hit the board in three of his last four and has changed hands after both of his last two. This son of Bettors Delight will be making his first attempt under the care of conditioner Shayne Barrington. He should be confident coming into this and is among the chances.

This 24-time winner lit the lamp in six of 12 last season and was dominant in victory in his second try off the shelf in that campaign. He should be chomping at the bit in a race that is void of Logan Park and stablemate Gaines Hanover and is our best bet of the night.

**#1 PEMBERTON** was just ahead of the one above in third in his latest and rounded out the trifecta at nearly 41-1. He earned a minor award the week before when Bob McClure hopped aboard for the first time and that began his trend in the right direction after being seventh or worse in his two prior efforts. This 16-time winner disappointed as the 3/5 favorite in the final of the New Holland Series when something must have gone amiss but can build off his latest performance in this top trotting class on the circuit. He will work from the pole position and will be our main player underneath.

**#6 LOOKS LIKE MONI** has hit the board in each of his last four since returning to action after a layoff of more than eight months and was the runner-up to Gaines Hanover in the top condition class a couple of weeks ago. He claimed the show spot at or near this level in his three tries before that and will have top teamster James MacDonald back between the wheels this evening. This son of Muscle Hill will have the benefit of leaving from post-six and has proven to be more than competitive against these types. He can hit the ticket.

**#4 SOUTHWIND COORS** had to settle for a smaller share in fifth in his latest and was used hard in the middle stages two back before he faded back to eighth as the 3/5 choice of the betting public. He was the runner-up in back-to-back appearances at this level in April and was second or better in each of his first five attempts at the age of four. This son of Walner likely needed an easier trip in his most recent effort and can be in the mix throughout from post-four. He can pick up a piece.

He had his win-streak snapped at six in that spin around this oval but stole victory from Mr Ibiza N by slipping up the cones in the dying strides at that level two starts ago. This 28-time winner will now have his price tag lowered back to \$40,000 to once again compete in this claiming handicap event and will be reunited with driver Doug McNair. He should much prefer the competition he faces this time around and can get back to his winning ways in this spot.

**#3 HEAD HONCHO** got away in the three-hole from post-nine in his latest and elected to stay on the cones before being cemented on the inside on the final turn. He was able to stick handle his way to clearance in the stretch but did not have much momentum on his side when the one below paced past his foes in the late stages. This son of Control The Moment has been discounted by \$4,000 in tonight's tilt and that helps him draw a much better spot on the gate with the four-hole. He will likely get forwardly placed once again and he can be right there at the finish with some racing luck.

**#5 ORDER ONE TO GO** exits the same race as the one above and blew up the tote board at 29-1 when he swept the field from last in the stretch. He was 12 lengths off the lead at the quarter pole after he got away ninth off the gate from post-eight and paced his back-half in 55.2 with a final panel in 27.3. This 12-time winner will move in a few spots on the gate when getting jammed right back in for the same \$37,000 price tag he was offered for last time and might not have as far to come this time around. He has hit the board in eight of his last 10 at this level and his stock rises if there are fractions to chase again this week.

**#2 TREACHEROUS TOM** has won two in a row and has scored by a combined margin of more than five lengths while racing over two venues that are nearly 500 km apart. He stopped the clock in 1:53.3 in his latest but was two seconds quicker over this surface almost two weeks earlier. This 14-time winner was claimed back by trainer Isaac Waxman for \$7,000 more than he lost him two starts ago and was second or better in each of his three tries for this barn. He will face significantly tougher competition this evening but is not without a chance.

This 22-time winner has more than \$800,000 in career earnings and will likely be pointed towards the lead in the early going from post-three this time around. She is the class of the field and is hard to look past in the finale.

**#10 LOCATELLI** was one we were fond of in his latest when he was the runner-up to Yo Mister and completed the exacta as the third choice in the betting at 5/2. He had only secured a smaller share in one of his previous four outings but was left with a lot of work to do in most of those outings. This 15-time winner will get another crack at this class but must leave from the dreaded 10-hole. He has proven to be versatile in his racing style and can be right there at the finish.

**#4 PIKACHU HANOVER** exited the same race as the one above and earned a minor award in fifth after getting away sixth off the switch from post-nine. He has picked up a lesser share in each of his last two since dropping down to this level and can benefit from getting back on a regular rotation. This 38-time winner will slide down to the four-hole and might have his gas pedal pressed off the gate this time around. He has proven he can come out on top against much tougher groups in the past and is worth a look if the price is right.

**#2 PHOENIX** has been eighth or worse in each of his last two in the class above this and should appreciate getting back down to the spot where he has hit the board in all of his last four. He has had a week off between appearances and will move in another three positions on the gate to post-two. This 20-time winner can be dangerous with a favorable journey and will have Bob McClure at the helm for the sixth time in seven starts. He cannot be left off the bottom end of the exotics.

**#5 KAMERAN HANOVER** was seventh last week after getting away in that position off the switch from post-two. He was more than 11 lengths off the lead at the quarter pole before he trotted his back-half in 55.2 with a final panel in 27.2 and claimed the show spot in each of his previous two attempts in this class. This 24-time winner picks up the driving services of James MacDonald for the first time in his career and should not be ruled out.
